PROGRAM INFORMATION

This degree requires you to select an emphasis from the following selection: Applied Research, Corrections, Family Studies, Health and Gerontology, or Individualized study. See the Catalog and consult your Sociology Faculty Advisor in your emphasis selection.

You may use individualized coursework (in SOC 408, 466, 485, and 497) toward your Applied Sociology Degree with the following conditions. You must obtain prior written approval from your Sociology faculty advisor and the Sociology Department. You must use only individualized coursework with a SOC prefix. You may not take more than 6 units of SOC 485 or SOC 497. Individualized coursework includes the following: SOC 408 (Field Work 1-12 units maximum) SOC 485 (Undergraduate Research 1-6 units maximum) SOC 497 (Independent Study 1-6 units maximum) and SOC 466 (Legislative Internship 1-12 units maximum).

You should take no more than 6 units of sociology courses as web-based courses. Engagement with the community of sociology majors and faculty is a critical component of your education, and participation in the sociology learning community is best achieved by participating in face-to-face NAU courses.
