PROGRAM INFORMATION

You may use individualized coursework (SOC 485, 497, SOC466 or SOC408) toward your Sociology Degree with the following conditions. You must obtain prior written approval from your Sociology faculty advisor and the Sociology Department. You must use only individualized coursework with a SOC prefix. You may not take more than 6 units of SOC 485 or SOC497. Individualized coursework includes the following: SOC408 (Field Work 1-12 units maximum), SOC485 (Undergraduate Research 1-6 units maximum), SOC 497 (Independent Study 1-6 units maximum) and SOC466 (Legislative Internship 1-12 units maximum). Additional units of SOC466 and SOC408 may be used to fulfill general electives.

You should take no more than 6 units of Sociology courses as web-based courses. Engagement with the community of Sociology majors and faculty is a critical component of your education, and participation in the Sociology Learning Community is best achieved by participating in face-to-face NAU courses.
