B.S./B.A. IN SPEECH COMMUNICATION

The School of Communication requires that you complete the following courses with a grade of C or better: School of Communication Core:

COM 101 (3 units) Communication Analysis

COM 200 (3 units) Basic Communication Theory

Liberal Studies Foundations

ENG 105 and MAT 110 or 114 or their equivalents

If you don't receive a grade of C or better in any of these courses, you must repeat the course(s) and earn a grade of C or better, within the parameters of the course repeat policies outlined in your catalog.

Be aware that courses in your major may have prerequisites that you must complete before taking those other courses.

You must earn a grade of C or better in all courses required for this speech communication major. At least 21 of the 42 units of major requirements must be at the 300 level or higher. Note that NAU requires that at least 30 units of the courses you take for your degree must be upper-division courses (those numbered 300 and above).

Please note that you must complete NAU's diversity requirements by taking two, 3-unit courses, one in ethnic diversity and one in global awareness. These courses may be used to meet other requirements within your academic plan if you choose them carefully.

If you choose a pre-law emphasis you complete 18 units for that emphasis, rather than completing a minor.

With your major advisor's approval, you may complete a 15-unit certificate program plus 3 additional units of coursework in place of a minor.

You may apply up to 3 units of SC 408 toward your major requirements.

BE AWARE THAT THE FINAL RESPONSIBILITY OF SELECTING COURSES RESTS WITH YOU. IT IS YOUR FULL RESPONSIBILITY TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF YOUR COURSE OF STUDY, IN THEIR PROPER ORDER, SO YOU DON'T FIND YOURSELF IN YOUR SENIOR YEAR INELIGIBLE FOR GRADUATION.
