#### PROGRAM INFORMATION

You are strongly encouraged to meet frequently with you Anthropology faculty advisor in planning your courses. Minor selection, graduate school plans and specialized goals should be discussed with an advisor early in your program to maximize your course choices.

You may use individualized coursework (ANT 485, 497, 466 or 408) toward your Anthropology Degree with the following conditions. You must obtain prior written approval from your Anthropology faculty advisor and the Anthropology Department. You must use only individualized coursework with a ANT prefix. You may not take more than 6 units of ANT 485 or ANT 497. Individualized coursework includes the following: ANT 408 (Fieldwork 1-12 units maximum), ANT 485 (Undergraduate Research 1-6 units maximum), ANT 497 (Independent Study 1-6 units maximum) and ANT 466 (Legislative Internship 1-12 units maximum). Additional units of ANT 466 and ANT 408 may be used to fulfill general electives. You must earn a grade of C or better in the following courses: ANT329, ANT379, ANT309W, ANT359W, statistics requirement, and ANT407C to complete your Anthropology degree.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Honors students complete different requirements to meet NAU's Liberal Studies program. Students should consult an Honors Program advisor for complete information on fulfilling Honors Liberal Studies requirements.
- All students are required to complete at least 120 total units which includes:
