PROGRAM INFORMATION

You are required to select an emphasis from the following: Applied Research, Corrections, Family Studies, Health and Gerontology, or Individualized study. See the Catalog and consult your Sociology Faculty Advisor in your emphasis selection.

You may use individualized coursework toward your Applied Sociology Degree with the following conditions. You must obtain prior written approval from your Sociology faculty advisor and the Sociology Department. You must use only individualized coursework with a SOC prefix. Individualized coursework includes the following: SOC408 (Field Work 1-12 units maximum) SOC485 (Undergraduate Research 1-6 units maximum) SOC 497 (Independent Study 1-6 units maximum) and SOC466 (Legislative Internship 1-12 units maximum).

All 36 units required for the major must be earned with a grade of "C" or higher. While you are not required to repeat a class where you earned a "D" you must have the total of 36 units of Sociology courses with a grade of "c" or above.

You should take no more than 6 units of sociology courses as web-based courses. Engagement with the community of sociology majors and faculty is a critical component of your education, and participation in the sociology learning community is best achieved by participating in face-to-face NAU courses.
