## **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

To earn your Bachelor of Science in Education in Geography Secondary Education you must complete 31 units of professional courses offered by the College of Education to qualify for certification to teach geography in Arizona and most other states. For information about these requirements, see the heading Teacher Preparation in Secondary Education (within Teaching and Learning) in the Education section of the 2006-2007 Academic Catalog. You should also receive advisement from the College of Education for this part of your academic plan.

You should also know that all B.S.Ed. majors at NAU must have a grade point average of at least 2.5 in all NAU coursework in order to graduate. Also be aware that, for the B.S.Ed. degree, you must have the following: a grade of at least B for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent)(If you don't receive a B, you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above, with at least a B, to meet this requirement.) a grade of at least C for the mathematics foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155).

Some required courses or options for requirements require pre-requisites. Check with the Catalog or your Geography Advisor.

You must have a grade of C or higher in all courses applied to your major to earn your Geography degree.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- All students are required to complete at least 120 total units which includes:
