PROGRAM INFORMATION

To earn the extended Degree in Public Planning you must chose a Focus from the following options: Environmental Planning, Indigenous/Native American Planning, Geographic Information Systems, Land Use Planning, and Recreation and Tourism Planning. See your Public Planning advisor when making this selection.

You may use individualized coursework (PL 408, 485, and 497) toward your Public Planning Degree with the following conditions:

You must obtain prior written approval from your Public Planning faculty advisor and the Department of Geography, Planning and Recreation. You must use only individualized coursework with a PL prefix. Individualized coursework includes the following: PL 408 (Field Work 1-12 units maximum), PL 485 (Undergraduate Research 1-6 units maximum), and PL 497 (Independent Study 1-6 units maximum). Note that PL 499 may be taken for 1-3 units maximum.

Consult with your Public Planning faculty advisor on selecting from these individualized courses.

You must have an overall or cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and you must have a grade of C or higher in all courses applied to your major to earn your Public Planning degree.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Honors students complete different requirements to meet NAU's Liberal Studies program. Students should consult an Honors Program advisor for complete information on fulfilling Honors Liberal Studies requirements.
- All students are required to complete at least 120 total units which includes:
