The goal of this degree is to promote healthy behaviors in the general population through community interventions.

Admission Requirements

If you are seeking a degree in Community Health Sciences, you must make formal application to the program. We accept applications at set times each year (Oct 1 and March 1); contact the Health Sciences Academic Advising office or visit the Health Sciences home page http://jan.ucc.nau.edu/~hs-p/docs/BS_Upper_Division_Community_Health_Application.pdf for the program application. You must be formally admitted to the community health education program to take all courses with an HS prefix **except HS 200, 205, 300, 350, and 303.**

To apply to the community health program, you must:

- Have completed 45 units of coursework
- Have completed 15 units of liberal studies coursework in discipline studies with a grade point average of at least 2.5
- Have a grade of at least 3.0 (B) in English foundation coursework (ENG 105 or equivalent)
(If you don't meet this requirement, you may take an approved writing course at the 200 level or higher to replace an English foundations course to the achieve the 3.0 requirement)
- Have completed HS 200 with a grade of 3.0 (B) or better
- Provide a written composition of at least 500 words, adequately explaining why you want to acquire a degree in community health education.

Please note that to earn this degree you must have an NAU grade point average of at least 2.5 and a GPA of 2.5 in all Health Sciences coursework, with no grade below a C in Health Sciences courses.

General Information

To earn this degree, you must complete at least 120 units of coursework, which we describe in the sections that follow:

- At least 35 units of liberal studies requirements. <http://www4.nau.edu/aio/Articulation/LScourcelist.htm>
- At least 64 units of major requirements.
- Elective courses, if needed, to reach an overall total of at least 120 units.

Be aware that some courses required for your degree do have prerequisites that you must also take. And, that the required grade must be earned in the prerequisite in order to take further coursework.

Please note that you complete NAU's diversity requirements by taking two 3-unit courses, one in ethnic diversity and one in global awareness. These courses may be used to meet other requirements within your academic plan if you choose them carefully. <http://www4.nau.edu/aio/Articulation/DiversityCourseList/htm>

Also be aware that NAU requires that at least 30 units of the courses you take for your degree must be upper-division courses (those numbered 300 and above).

This degree progression plan is to be used in conjunction with the academic catalog and degree progress report.

Students should see an academic advisor regularly to confirm their academic progress.

Students must see an academic advisor before enrollment for the 7th term in preparation for graduation.

Submit graduation application during 7th term.

Honors students complete different requirements to meet NAU's liberal studies program. Students should consult an Honors Program advisor for complete information on fulfilling Honors Liberal Studies requirements.
