PROGRAM INFORMATION

To earn the extended Degree in Parks and Recreation Management you must chose an Emphasis from the following options: Community and Commercial Recreation, Individualized, Park Protection, Tourism, Wildland Recreation Management and Outdoor Education and Leadership. See your Parks and Recreation Management faculty advisor when making this selection.

You may be required to take classes during the summer to fulfill the sequence requirements. Consult your Parks and Recreation Faculty in scheduling your classes.

You may use additional individualized coursework (PRM 497) toward your Parks and Recreation Management Degree but you must obtain prior written approval from your Parks and Recreation Management faculty advisor and the Department of Geography, Planning and Recreation. You must use only individualized coursework with a PRM prefix. Note that you may take PRM 398, 399, or 499 for 1-3 units maximum. Consult with your Parks and Recreation Management faculty advisor on selecting from these individualized courses. The faculty strongly recommend that you obtain Wilderness First Responder(PRM 216)/ or EMS certification as part of your plan.

This degree is accredited by the National Recreation and Park Association and the American Association of Leisure and Recreation.

You must have an overall or cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and you must have a grade of "C" or higher in all lower –and upper-division core courses, including repeated courses to graduate.

You must have 27 units of the 56 units of major requirements taken at NAU to earn your degree.
