The goal of this degree is to promote healthy behaviors of children and adolescents through school programs.

To earn this degree, you must complete at least 129 units of coursework, which we describe in the sections that follow:

- o At least 35 units of liberal studies requirements. Be aware that you may not use courses with a PE prefix to satisfy these liberal studies requirements.
- o At least 50 units of major requirements, including 3 units of Fieldwork Experience PE 408
- o At least 27 units of teacher-preparation requirements
- o 18-24 units of minor coursework

Please note that you must complete NAU's diversity requirements by taking two 3-unit courses, one in ethnic diversity and one in global awareness. These courses may be used to meet other requirements within your academic plan if you choose them carefully.

Also be aware that NAU requires at least 30 units of the courses you take for your degree must be upper-division courses (those numbered 300 and above).

Additionally, you should be aware that you must have a grade point average of at least 2.5 in all of your NAU coursework in order to graduate. This applies to all B.S.Ed. majors at NAU

Also be aware that, for the B.S.Ed. degree, you must have the following:

- O A grade of at least B for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent) (If you don't receive a 3.0, you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above with at least a B, to meet this requirement.)
- o A grade of at least C for the mathematics foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155)
