6. The [Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act](#)¹⁰ (FERPA) protects the privacy of education records, provides student rights to inspect and review their education records, and provides guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. For more information about FERPA, including Northern Arizona University's annual notification of rights regarding education records, please review the appendix in the on-line [Student Handbook](#)³.
7. Students are allowed to change, edit, and/or restrict certain directory information (telephone, address, e-mail) that Northern Arizona University maintains. You can do this yourself on [LOUIE](#)¹¹. Log into [LOUIE](#)¹¹ and navigate to:

Self Service > Campus Personal Information > Privacy Settings > Edit FERPA/Directory Restrictions

You will be provided choices as to what information you want the university to share about you. Keep in mind that if you restrict certain information from being released to the general public this may make it difficult for individuals to reach you. We want to remind you that the directory information provided on [LOUIE](#)¹¹ is the only official source of Northern Arizona University directory information. Other services may exist on the internet but they are not affiliated with Northern Arizona University. For security reasons, use caution when releasing personal information to these various services.

8. Students may not copy, download, or share software, documents, or files protected by copyright using the university's computing resources, unless you have written permission from the copyright holder. Violations of copyright law may result in the university revoking your access to computing resources, including computer labs and network connections. You may also be subject to disciplinary action under the terms of the [Student Code of Conduct](#)⁴. Additionally, those who violate copyright law are subject to criminal and civil legal action by federal authorities and copyright holders. 9. If the university receives a complaint about you from a copyright holder or copyright-holding organization such as the Recording Industry Association of America, your [ResNet](#)¹⁴ connection will immediately be turned off and will remain off until you speak with the Student Technology Center. In the event of a second offense, your ResNet connection will remain off until you meet with a representative from Student Life. See [Legal Alternatives](#)¹⁵ for file sharing for an up to date listing of legal sources for music, movies, television, video games and software.

11. Northern Arizona University is committed to providing a healthy educational environment, consistent with university policies and free from unlawful acts.
