

Welcome to CCC2NAU!

QUICK START

1. Apply to CCC
2. Apply to CCC2NAU
3. Attend an Info Session
4. Meet with a CCC2NAU advisor
5. Register and pay for classes.

Getting started:

While it is only required that students be in the CCC2NAU program for one semester prior to their transition to NAU, we find students have the most success when they start the program as they are enrolling in their first semester of CCC coursework. This is the best way to maximize the program's benefits!

1. Apply for free to [Coconino Community College](#) by filling out the online application. If you have questions about the application process, call 928-226-4299.
2. Apply for free to [CCC2NAU](#); click on "how to apply." Take note that if you have already applied to NAU, you will need to use a different email address than the one you originally used to apply to NAU. Put in your expected dates of attendance.
3. Attend a mandatory one hour Info Session in person or complete the [online](#) one. Info Sessions are provided weekly. You are not required to RSVP. Please attend one at your earliest convenience.
4. Make an initial advising appointment with a CCC2NAU advisor by calling 928-226-4323.

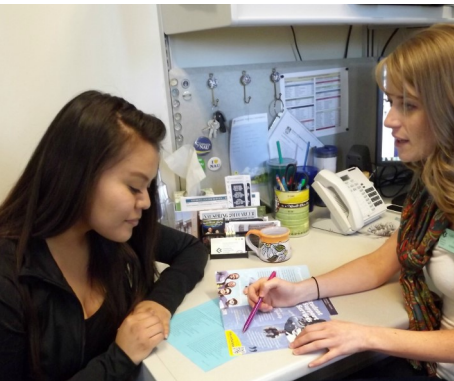
What to bring to your advising appointment:

- ⇒ A copy of your SAT or ACT scores OR
- ⇒ A copy of your English and math placement test scores ([placement tests](#) can be taken at CCC before your advising appointment)
- ⇒ A copy of your [immunization records](#) showing proof of two measles, mumps, and rubella shots (MMR)
- ⇒ Your official final high school transcripts and AP test scores if you have them
- ⇒ Official transcripts from any colleges or universities you attended prior to CCC (official transcripts are in sealed envelopes)



Remember that CCC2NAU advisors see students on an appointment basis only. Be sure to make your appointment in advance by calling 928-226-4323.

You will be considered a "dual citizen" - a degree seeking student at CCC and a non-degree seeking student at NAU

What's next:

You will be sent two letters confirming your admission to both institutions. In the letters you will be given your NAU login and ID number and your CCC comet login and ID number. Follow the instructions to set up your student accounts at both schools.

Registration:

When registering for your classes, CCC requires that you first meet with an advisor to clear your mandatory advising hold. Registration also requires payment upon registration. Students can pay by cash, credit card, or through financial aid or tribal scholarships that have been awarded. [Tuition rates](#) are determined by [residency](#). There is also a [payment plan](#) available for students to pay in installments. Your advisor will work with you to select appropriate classes for your degree.

Special circumstances:

- ⇒ If you do not attend a required Info Session and do not meet with an advisor for an initial advising appointment, you will be removed from the program. You must enroll at CCC in the first semester you apply or you will be removed from the program. You have the option then to re-apply for a future term.
- ⇒ Are you coming from out of town? We recommend making your initial advising appointment with a CCC2NAU advisor on the same day as an Info Session, and/or a placement test to maximize your visit.
- ⇒ Do you need accommodations through Disability Resources? Visit the [Disability Resources webpage](#) for more information about the services provided. You can make an appointment with the Disability Resources Coordinator, by calling 928-226-4323.

Housing:

NAU campus housing operated by NAU Residence Life is no longer available to CCC2NAU students starting Fall 2017. However, CCC students can apply for housing on the NAU campus provided in partnership with a private vendor, [American Campus Communities](#), as of April 1st, 2017. We encourage students to explore housing options as early as possible and to include housing costs in your financial planning for college. Because Coconino Community College does not provide on-campus housing, this is one area in which students and families will need to plan proactively. While we would love to help you with your housing plans, the best place to start is with the resources listed above.
