



Northern Arizona University, in partnership with Coconino County and the Arizona Department of Emergency and Military Affairs, will take part in a statewide COVID-19 Testing Surge, offering free COVID-19 walk-in testing to all NAU community members.

When: Daily from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., Aug. 10-23

Where: NAU's University Union Fieldhouse, 1050 Knoles Drive

Who: Testing is intended for Coconino County residents, including NAU faculty, staff and students. You do not need an order from a medical provider to be tested; however, [preregistration will be required to test](#). If you are symptomatic, contact Campus Health Services or your health care provider for next steps.

What to know: Masks should be worn, physical distancing should be observed and signs and traffic flow instructions should be followed while on the NAU campus. NAU faculty, staff and students on campus are encouraged to walk to the testing site. Free parking will be available for community members on the upper levels of the San Francisco Parking Garage—please do not park on the first floor as it is being used for residence hall move-in. You must bring your [preregistration voucher](#) and a government-issued ID on the day of testing. Students living on campus should use their [residence hall address](#) when preregistering. Non-essential personal items will not be allowed in the testing area (i.e. food, beverages, etc.).

How will tests be administered: Nasal swab tests will be self-administered. Certified health care personnel will be onsite demonstrating how to properly administer the test. [Download the instructions to learn how to test yourself for COVID-19](#). If you need assistance with administering a test, you may bring someone to assist you. The specimen will be tested by the FEMA subcontractor, eTrueNorth.

How will I get results: Results should be delivered within 3-5 business days. You will receive an email notification when results are available. Follow the instructions in the email to view results. To help protect others, people who have been exposed to a confirmed COVID-19 case and are awaiting their test results, should stay home and quarantine until negative results are received.
