

Return to On-Campus Work Daily Self Screening

To help protect all members of our NAU campus community, all employees need to perform a daily self-screening prior to coming to campus for work. Please ask yourself the following questions:

- Do I have a cough?
- Do I have a fever greater than 100.4-degree Fahrenheit?
- Do I have chills?
- Do I have an unusual, persistent headache?
- Do I have shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Have I lost my sense of taste or smell?
- Do I have any new respiratory problems (e.g., wheezing, congestion)?
- Do I have abdominal discomfort?

If you can answer “**yes**” to one or more of the above questions, you must notify your supervisor and not come to campus or any NAU facility.

Sick employees should not return to work until all of these criteria are met:

- At least ten days have passed since your symptoms first appeared.
- You have had no fever for at least 72 hours (without fever-reducing medication).
- Your other symptoms have improved.

Other Considerations:

Those caring for a sick person should quarantine for 14 days after the patient has been fever-free and their symptoms are improving.

REMINDER: If you have been diagnosed with COVID-19, you must notify your supervisor immediately. NAU will maintain confidentiality and work with the Coconino County Health Department to determine exposure to other members of the NAU community.
