



Parking Information

Year round, a vehicle must display a valid permit to park on campus excluding weekends, when the university is closed, or designated by special signage.

Weekdays (Monday - Friday) a permit is required in all lots or as posted. Resident lots are restricted 24 hours.

Weekdays (after 4:30 p.m.) commuter and most employee lots are open to all permits unless otherwise posted.

Weekends (Friday 4:30 p.m. - Sunday) a permit is not required in commuter and most employee lots unless otherwise posted.

Visitor Parking (hourly/daily options)

- Kiosk - purchase a permit here
- Parking garage (\$2 hourly/ \$10 daily)
- Public parking - purchase a permit at nearby kiosk (\$1.50 hourly/ \$7 daily)
- Pay by space - purchase a permit at nearby kiosk (\$1.50 hourly/ 2 hour max)
- No permit required after 4:30 p.m. (P13, P13B, P62, and P7A)
- Meter (\$2 hourly/ 2 hour max)
- Bus stop
- Patient parking (P28A, P48A, and P49 only)
- Parking and Shuttle Services
- University Police

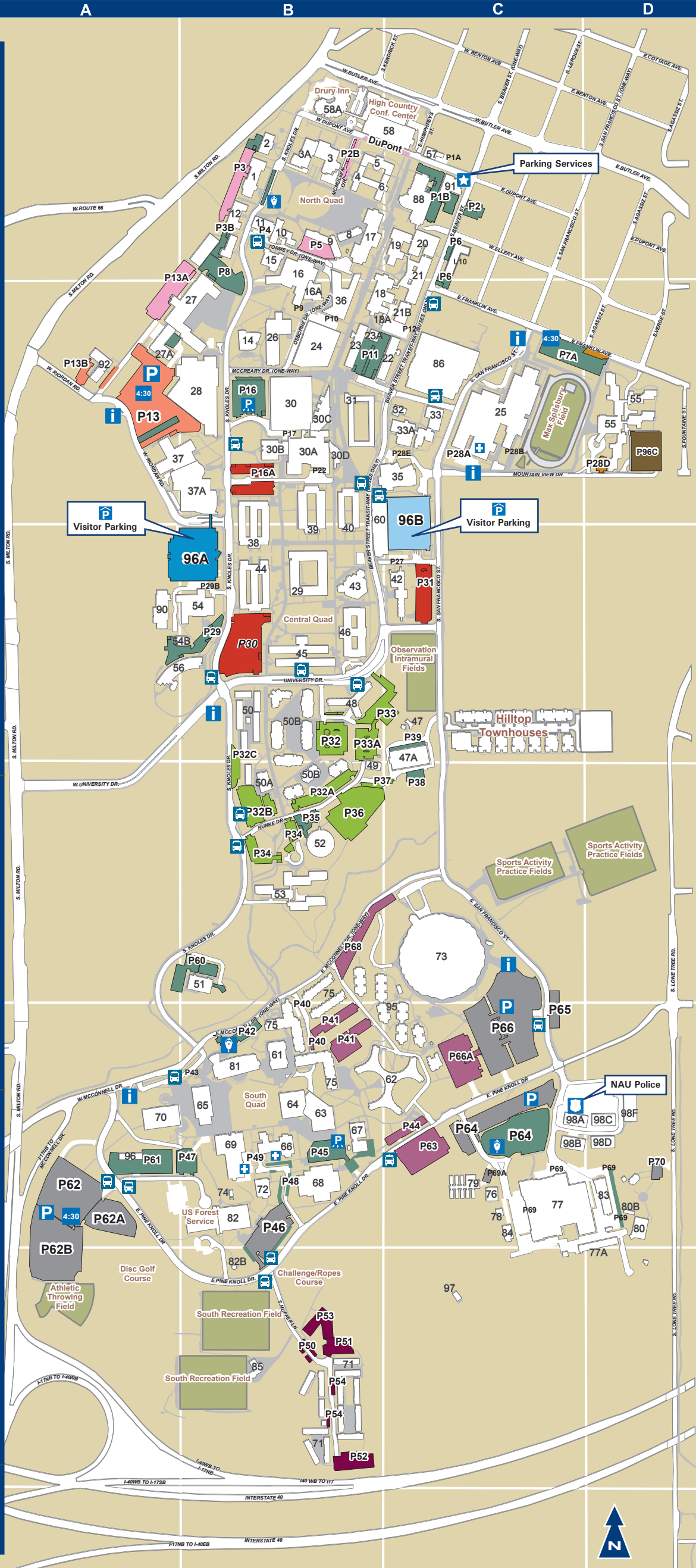
Informational Only (not on map)

- 15 minute parking no permit required stalls are located throughout campus.
- ADA accessible parking is located in proximity to all campus buildings and if unavailable, parking is permitted in any non-reserved stall with a valid NAU permit.

Visitor Parking

Daily and hourly parking options include pay by space, pay and display, metered parking, and parking garages. Permits may be obtained at kiosks located at most entrances to campus, or online if purchasing a SC (south commuter) permit.

Patient/Client Parking

Parking is available when visiting Health Services and Health Professions.

- Campus Health Services provides patient parking. Parking is located in the Health and Learning Center (HLC) parking lot south of the building (P28A). A code is required to enter at the kiosk to receive a temporary parking permit, and is included in the appointment reminder e-mail. Please use intercom located next to the kiosk to obtain a code. If visiting Health Services as a walk-in client, follow the instructions on the kiosk located in the parking lot to print a permit valid for up to two hours.

- Health Professions provides non-affiliated client parking. Parking is located on south campus in parking lots P48A and P49. A permit is issued from the appropriate office in the Health Professions building (P66).

Shuttle Information

Shuttle Services provides transportation through campus by way of two routes.

Louie Line

Shuttles run from the Walkup Skydome northbound to the HLC. Service operates Monday through Thursday 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. and Friday 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Rapid Ride

Shuttles run from SBS northbound to Old Main. Service operates Monday through Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

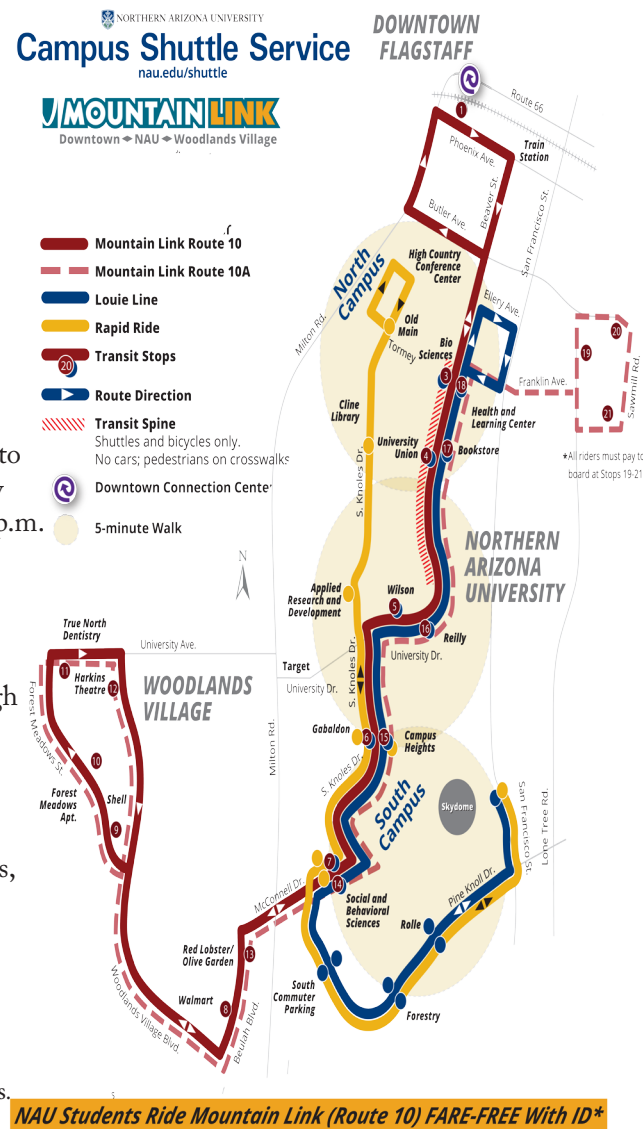
Route 10

The local transit service, Mountain Link, provides shuttle service through campus. Mountain Link is fare-free with NAU ID. Service operates Monday through Friday 6:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m., and offers limited operating hours on weekends, NAU holidays, breaks, and closures.

Motorist Assistance

Parking Services offers help with jump starts, dead batteries, tire inflations, lockouts, emergency gas, and bike lock cuts (for registered bikes only). Assistance is available Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. during the academic year, and Monday through Friday 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. during breaks. For motorist assistance call 928-523-9066, services are provided when staff is available.

Bike Program

Register your bike at the Parking Services office at no cost; just bring the bike and your JacksCard. Registration is essential in locating your bike if it is lost or stolen, or if you are requesting your lock to be cut. Parking Services also offers bike locker and enclosure rentals to protect your bike from the elements.
