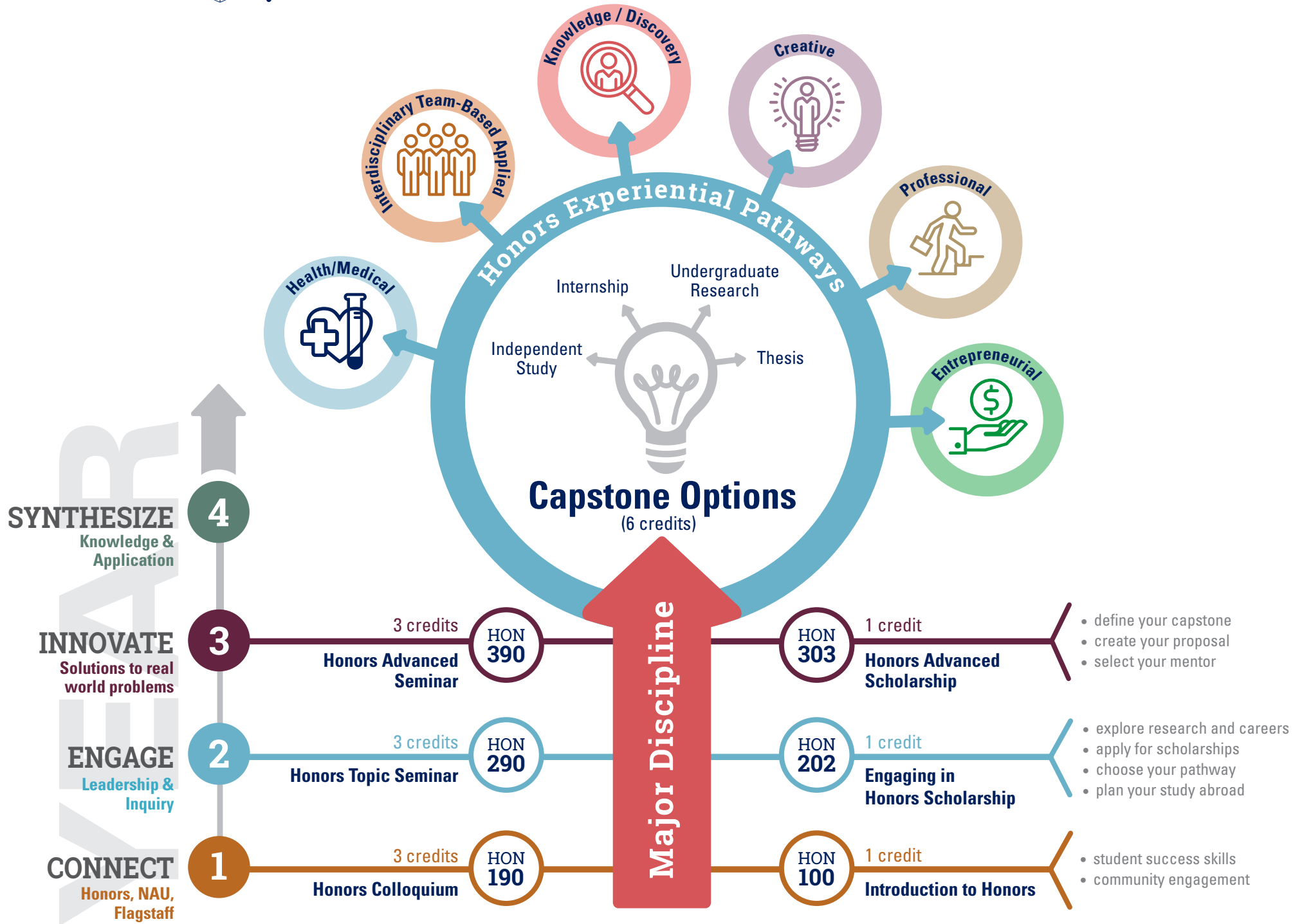


# The Honors College Difference



## **Honors Capstone Pathways: It's your future. You choose.**

*Put what you learn in the classroom to work in the world*

### **Health/Medical Pathway**

***Want to go to medical school or a top-notch physical therapy program?***

Pursue a career in medicine, nursing, public health, or other health related fields. The Health/Medical Pathway is ideal for students in Biomed, Nursing, Public Health, and Exercise Science; but could include students in majors such as Psychological Sciences, Anthropology, or Social Work interested in health related fields or projects in rural or urban communities in Arizona or around the world.

### **Entrepreneurial Pathway**

***Do you want to start a business?***

Put ideas into action. Write a business plan and get the business rolling. Marketing, finance, and engineering students are likely candidates for entering this pathway; however, students from any major with the desire, creativity, passion, and an idea could follow the Entrepreneurial Pathway.

### **Interdisciplinary Team-Based Applied Pathway**

***Do you dream of being a part of a team that solves a real-world problem?***

Work with a team of students from different majors to help solve a real world issue or problem. Imagine a team of engineering, social work, and business students working on a project to design, test, and market a wheelchair for use in rugged terrain in developing countries. Or envision a team of biology, public health, and anthropology students working with NAU Researcher Paul Keim to address the spread of the Zika virus in Brazil.

### **Knowledge/Discovery Pathway**

***Want to take a deep dive into research or get accepted into a top-tier graduate school?***

Pursue your own research project. Apply to a top-tier graduate school. Typically, you would complete a thesis, but other options could be tailored to your interests, such as documenting an internship and/or presenting an undergraduate research project. Majors in the humanities, sciences, or social sciences are all likely students for the Knowledge/Discovery Pathway.

### **Creative Pathway**

***Are you a musician, a writer, an artist, or a filmmaker?***

Start a career in the creative fields or continue on to graduate school. Intern with an artist or arts organization. Study abroad. Create a portfolio that might include artwork, a film, play, novel, or a music composition.

### **Professional Pathway**

***Are you interested in a professional career such as finance, accountancy, education, journalism, engineering, or law?***

If so, the Professional Pathway could help you achieve your goals through international internships, the identification of scholarships and grants, and participation in organizations that prepare you to apply your combination of knowledge and skills developed in rigorous Honors liberal studies courses and your major to be prepared for professional graduate programs and outstanding careers.
