There are some small, but significant inconsistencies across three policies that impact the role of a D in graduate studies. A small, but critical, change in language has been proposed.

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[4] Policy 100318 - Course Repeat Policy \* (Melinda Treml, Kyle N. Winfree)

A minor change to the course repeat policy was proposed late in the discussions last year, which may address the vast majority of concerns. The committee ran out of time for further discussion then. This proposed change is as follows:

#### Current

Graduate students do not normally repeat courses. However, if a grade of "C", "D", or "F" is received in a graduate course, students may repeat that course with advisor approval.

Courses repeated under the regular grading scale **do not** replace the grade for the prior course, and both grades are used in the computation of the cumulative grade point average (GPA).

Courses repeated under the P/F grading scale **do** replace the grade for the prior course, and only the repeated course grade will be used in the computation of the cumulative GPA.

Units earned for repeated courses may only be used once to fulfill graduation requirements.

#### Proposed

Graduate students do not normally repeat courses. However, if a grade of "C", "D", or "F" is received in a graduate course, students may repeat that course with advisor approval.

Courses repeated under the regular grading scale **do not** replace the grade for the prior course, and both grades are used in the computation of the cumulative grade point average (GPA).

Courses repeated under the regular grading scale would appear on the transcript, but only the higher of the two grades will be calculated in the GPA.

Courses repeated under the P/F grading scale **do** replace the grade for the prior course, and only the repeated course grade will be used in the computation of the cumulative GPA.

Units earned for repeated courses may only be used once to fulfill graduation requirements.

"A minimum of 5 hours of professional development activities is required between matriculation in the program and admission to candidacy."
