

Health Promotion: Sexual Assault and Relationship Violence (SARV) Prevention Graduate Assistantship 2020-2021 School Year

The Health Promotion Office in Campus Health Services is offering a 20-hour a week Graduate Assistant position for the academic year. This position will be responsible for coordinating education and outreach activities for the primary prevention of sexual assault and relationship violence on the Flagstaff campus. This position works collaboratively with campus stakeholders to raise awareness of sexual violence through trainings, written materials and educational events. This position also serves a leadership role in coordinating and training a group of peer educators. This position reports to the Director of Health Promotion.

Job Description:

- Deliver educational presentations on a variety of sexual violence topics, based on best practices and effective public health approaches
- Assist in coordinating Sexual Assault Awareness Month and Domestic Violence Awareness Month activities
- Work with campus liaisons who are involved in response services related to SARV
- Recruit, train and supervise 5 student peer educators
- Assist with the development of training and education materials
- Assist with program evaluation
- Other duties as assigned

Minimum Qualifications:

- Accepted in a graduate program at Northern Arizona University
- Bachelor's degree in related field
- Ability to work 20 hours per week- including some evening and weekend hours

- Bachelor's degree in Public Health
- Acceptance in the Master's of Public Health Program at Northern Arizona University
- Experience creating and delivering educational trainings
- Experience working with sexual violence and/or substance abuse prevention

- Ability to build and maintain positive working relationships across campus
- Experience with Microsoft Office
- Experience with marketing and/or promoting programs and events
- Knowledge of and sensitivity to multicultural issues
