Information for New Students: Fall 2019

Getting started:

While it is only required that students be in the CCC2NAU program for one semester prior to their transition to NAU, we find students have the most success when they start the program as they are enrolling in their first semester of CCC coursework. This is the best way to maximize the program's benefits!

Quick Start:

1. Apply to CCC
 2. Apply to CCC2NAU
 3. Complete the online Info Session
 4. Meet with a CCC2NAU advisor
 5. Register and pay for classes.
1. Apply to Coconino Community College by filling out the online [application](#). If you have questions about the application process, call 928-226-4299.
 2. Apply to CCC2NAU; click on "[how to apply](#)." Take note that if you already applied to NAU, you will need to use a different email address than the one you originally used to apply to NAU. You could also just let us know and we can adjust your application accordingly.
 3. Complete the online [Info Session](#) and the online agreement form. This is required to be in CCC2NAU.
 4. Make an initial advising appointment with a CCC2NAU advisor by calling 928-226-4323.

What to bring to your advising appointment:

- ❖ A copy of your SAT or ACT scores OR
- ❖ A copy of your English and math placement test scores ([placement tests](#) can be taken at CCC before your advising appointment)
- ❖ Your official final high school transcripts in a sealed envelope and AP test scores if you have them
- ❖ Official transcripts from any colleges or universities you attended prior to CCC (official transcripts are in sealed envelopes or you can have them sent electronically to CCC)

Remember that CCC2NAU advisors see students on an appointment basis only. Be sure to make your appointment in advance by calling 928-226-4323.

You will be considered a “dual citizen” - a degree seeking student at CCC and a non-degree seeking student at NAU

Paying for classes:

CCC requires payment upon registration. Students can pay by cash, credit card, or through financial aid that have been awarded. [Tuition](#) rates are determined by residency. There is also a [payment plan](#) option available for students to pay in installments.

Financial Aid:

If you are submitting a FAFSA to apply for financial aid, be sure to choose CCC as your parent institution. CCC’s Title IV school code is 031004. Scholarships:

CCC’s Foundation [scholarship application](#) opens in January each year and closes in early to mid-March. We encourage all CCC2NAU students to apply for scholarships as there are several scholarships allocated for only CCC2NAU students.

Bookstore:

After you register for classes at CCC, check out CCC’s bookstore to purchase your books. You can bring your schedule in and purchase books or you can purchase online through the bookstore [website](#).

Student ID cards:

Once you’ve paid for your classes or completed your financial aid file, go to CCC’s Security Desk to obtain your free CCC student ID card, as well as your free Mountain Line Bus pass. Once you’ve cleared your immunization hold at NAU, see your CCC2NAU advisor for a voucher for a free JacksCard.

Parking:

If you plan to drive to CCC’s campus, you will need a parking permit. Parking permits are \$60 a year or \$40 per semester. You can get a parking application and pay for your permit at Student Accounts. If you need to park on NAU’s campus, you can view purchasing options and pricing on NAU’s parking services [website](#). With your JacksCard you can ride route 10 and around campus for free.

Housing:

CCC2NAU students have the option to live in NAU residence halls. Log in to NAU’s [Housing Portal](#) to apply. Students are encouraged to apply as soon as possible. Please review the CCC2NAU [Housing FAQ](#) for more information. We encourage students to explore housing options as early as possible and to include housing costs in your financial planning for college. Because Coconino Community College does not provide on-campus housing, this is one area, which students and families will need to plan proactively. Check out [Louie’s List](#) for alternative off campus housing in Flagstaff.

Meal plans:

Students interested in purchasing a meal plan to use on NAU's campus may do so by contacting [Campus Dining](#).

Proof of Immunizations:

Since NAU is a residential campus all students must submit proof of two measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccines with NAU's Campus Health Services. You can upload your records at campushealth.nau.edu using your NAU login. If you will be completing an online degree at NAU, you will not need to clear this hold.

Visit Campus:

It is helpful to visit NAU's campus and become familiar with the university. NAU offers a few ways to visit and tour campus including a virtual tour. Check out the [Admissions website](#) to plan a visit that works for you.

Get involved on NAU's campus:

As a CCC2NAU student, you have the option of purchasing campus services and activities. This can include access to games and events and NAU's recreational and campus health services. Other:

- In order to stay in good standing with CCC2NAU, you must complete the required online Info Session and meet with a CCC2NAU advisor for Initial Advising. You also have to enroll in classes at CCC in the semester you applied. If you do not complete these required steps you will be removed from the program. If you can't enroll in the semester you applied let a CCC2NAU advisor know. You can always enroll in a later semester.
- Are you coming from out of town? We recommend making your Initial Advising appointment with a CCC2NAU advisor on the same day as placement testing to maximize your visit.
