Unofficial Transfer Plan – 2024-2025

To be completed at the Community College:

Associate degree coursework. 64 units in an associate's degree transfer block. If you have been awarded an AAS degree from an accredited Arizona community college, NAU will accept up to 75 transfer units.

Students must have an associate degree, either completed or in progress, from a regionally accredited institution and the *associate degree must be completed prior to the awarding of the BAS degree*. The associate degree may be in any field within 10 years of your application to NAU.

[AGEC](#) Requirements: What is an AGEC? The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) is a 35 credit general education block that fulfills the same lower division general education requirement at all three state universities. Follow hyperlink for more information.

To be completed at Northern Arizona University (45-56 credits):

Bachelor of Applied Science Requirements (18 units):
Designed to help you acquire a general knowledge of management, organizational, and policy issues while advancing your professional communication, computer, and quantitative skills. Other courses may be used to fulfill the core elective block. Please Note: At least 15 units in the core must be upper-division (300-400 level) courses.

Communication Block (3 units):

Public Administration and Management Block (6 units):

BBA 360 Teams and Project Management

Value, Ethics, and Policy Block (3 units):

Select one from the following: BBA 471C, CCJ 315, CCJ 325, CCJ 380, CCJ 450C, HUM 371, HUM 373, PADM 411, SOC 301, SOC 333, SOC 339, SOC 441

Technical, Quantitative, Qualitative and Science Block (3 units):

Select one from the following: BBA 340, BBA 201, BIO 301, BIO 302, CCJ 335, ESE 280, HS 404, PADM 355, PADM 356, POS 303, SOC 365, any course with a MAT or STA prefix, except MAT 101X, MAT 102X, MAT 108 or MAT 150.

Additional coursework is required if, after you have met the previously described requirements, you have not yet completed a total of 120 units of credit.

You may take these remaining courses from any of the academic areas, using these courses to pursue your specific interests and goals. You may also use prerequisites or transfer credits as electives if they weren't used to meet major, minor, or liberal studies requirements.

We encourage you to consult with your advisor to select the courses that will be most advantageous to you.

Accelerated Masters option:

With our 4+1 structure (4-year Bachelor's degree and 1-year Master's degree), a student can earn an undergraduate business degree in four years and with only one additional year of study, earn a Master of Global Business Administration degree.
