

Please keep the following instructions and telephone number(s) handy, as you may need them in the middle of a counseling session.

In case of a life threatening situation (i.e., heart attack, seizure, or someone with a gun):

- 1. Call 911
- 2. Describe the situation and location: NAU Practicum Lab, Room 169 in the Education Building #27

In case of a **crisis situation** (i.e., suicidal, threatening to hurt someone, or involved in child or elder abuse) ask the client to wait in the counseling room while the therapist steps out to contact their supervisor for advice.

- 1. Call supervising instructor or look for them in their office
- 2. If unable to contact immediate supervisor, attempt to contact another counseling faculty
- 3. If unable to contact any faculty, call NAU Counseling Service (928) 523-2261 for NAU students, and ask to speak with a psychologist.
- 4. If there is no psychologist available, contact: NAU Police for NAU students, 523-3000 or NAU Police for Flagstaff clients
