### **Bachelor of Science in Nursing Accelerated Program of Study**

#### **Code of Conduct**

Any student applying to the Northern Arizona University Bachelor of Science in Nursing program (traditional, accelerated, RN-BSN; CEP, Mid-AAS, or PL) who fails to exhibit professional and caring behaviors during any point of the application process will have their application disqualified from consideration.

#### **Pre-professional requirements**

You must have completed a bachelor's degree by the first day of the program and take the following 27 hours of prerequisite courses, or equivalents, before being admitted to the Accelerated BSN Program:

- BIO 201/L, BIO 202/L, BIO 205/L, and BIO 320 (15 hours)
- PSY 101 and PSY 240 (6 hours)
- NTS 135 or NTS 256 (3 hours)
- STA 270 or PSY 230 w/College Algebra or higher (3-4 hours)

Note: All prerequisite courses not taken at NAU need to be approved. Course descriptions and/or course syllabi must be provided to a Student Service Coordinator in Admissions for departmental approval.

#### **Professional curriculum requirements**

After meeting the pre-professional requirements and being admitted to the nursing program, you will take 52 hours of sequenced nursing courses over three semesters (12 months):

- NUR 334L Adult Health Nursing Practicum (6 credit hours)
- NUR 340 Research Applications to Nursing and Healthcare (3 credit hours)

#### **Semester III (Spring) 18 credit hours**

- NUR 335 Nursing Care of Child-Bearing Child-Rearing Families (4 credit hours)
- NUR 339 Nursing Care of Women, Children, and Families in the Community Practicum (3 credit hours)
- NUR 424 Nursing Informatics and Health Care Policy (3 credit hours)
