What to Expect:

Details will be discussed at orientation as well, but here is a start:

- It is recommended that to have reliable transportation to and from campus.
 - Local transportation is available in Phoenix but does not always stop near our clinical agencies.
 - o Carpool may also be an option.
 - o Not all clinicals are conducted in Phoenix Metro Area and will require traveling.
- Laptop is required.
- Course testing may be completed in-person or online.
- Classes, clinicals and labs are conducted in-person, unless otherwise communicated.
- The nursing advisor registers first semester students. The student completes all other semester registrations.
- First semester students do not get to make a request of days and times. Groups are established by the course faculty. All other semesters student requests are taken under consideration for clinical placement.
- Each semester of nursing school is different in terms of hours and classes.
 - Traditional students can expect to be in-person for class between 6-12 hours a week.
 - Online lecture for class 3-6 hours/week.
- Each semester students have skills labs and clinicals from 10 20 hours per week.
 - For example:
 - First semester students are in person for 3 classes for a total of 10 hours/week.
 - Online class 3 hours/week.
 - In clinical 10 hours/week.
- During the final semester, students complete a Preceptorship, in which they are at a healthcare agency with a precepting RN usually for 3 twelve-hour shifts per week.
- Clinical experiences are located in various healthcare and community agencies located throughout northern Arizona and each semester is different for clinical placement.
- We consider nursing school to be a full-time job as it requires a lot of time and energy between lectures, clinicals, labs, studying, and exams.
- A full-time work schedule is not usually feasible for most nursing students.
 - However, nursing students may find it necessary to work a part-time job while in nursing school.
 - Many get practical, hands-on job experience in the healthcare field.
 - The most important part of a part-time job is flexibility in the work schedule along with excellent time management skills.
