Brown Cleveland Lewis Scholarship (5435)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships to support students who meet the following criteria;

- A. Full-time undergraduate student enrolled in The W.A. Franke College of Business;
- B. African American or of African descent;
- C. First generation college student;
- D. Have demonstrated financial need;
- E. Freshman entering their sophomore year; and
- F. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 where 4.0 = A.

This scholarship is nonrenewable and previous recipients may not reapply.

Choice Hotels International Foundation Scholars (1357)

While preference will be given to underrepresented minority students with demonstrated need who show a particular interest in the hotel management program, no students of the School of Hotel and Restaurant Management will be excluded from this scholarship program. Based upon financial need, and the students' overall academic standing; providing financial assistance to ethnic minority and other financially needy students each year.

Darden Centennial Scholarship (1417)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships to support School of Hotel and Restaurant Management students with a preference* for students who meet the following criteria: a. Underrepresented minority students; b. Demonstrated financial need; c. Clearly demonstrate a particular interest in the restaurant and food service program; and d. Maintains a minimum grade point average of 3.0 (where "A" = 4.0)

*However, no students will be excluded from this scholarship program

Donald & Peggy Murray Scholarship (1266)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships for financially at-risk sophomore students in the College of Business Administration who display a potential to succeed if given adequate financial support. Everything being equal, preference in selection should be given to: a) female students, b) members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, or c) students from Mexico.

Garnet M Byers Academic Scholarship for Women (1320)

This Fund shall be used to support qualified women Hotel and Restaurant Management student(s)

Gennie H Reynolds Memorial Endowment (1229)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships to support students who meet the following criteria:

- Native American students
- Demonstrated financial need (not otherwise substantially subsidized by family, tribe or other non-employment sources)
- College of Business Administration student
- Graduate student (optional)
- Student is substantially involved in the arts (academically, creatively or as a facilitator, e.g., arts management...) and/or the environment (through employment or academic study in conservation, sustainability...) (optional)

Manuel T. Gauna Scholarship (5246) - housed in Enrollment/Student Affairs but for business students

This Fund shall be used to provide one annual scholarship to support a student who meets the following criteria:

- A. Latino heritage;
- B. Declared Business major;
- C. Enrolled full-time with at least 24 credit hours per year;
- D. Maintain a 3.0 GPA (4.0 scale), although a 2.5 GPA is acceptable for the first two years of college;
- E. Complete 20 hours of community service; and
- F. A letter of interest.

Richard Burns Esq. Endowed Scholarship for HRM (1349)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships for female students who meet the following criteria:

- Current full-time enrolled students of the School of Hotel and Restaurant Management Program
- Have a minimum college grade point average of 3.3 (A = 4.0)
- For high school students, planning to enroll full-time, cumulative high school minimum grade point average of 3.5 (A = 4.0)

The award(s) will be renewable from year to year provided the student remains enrolled full-time in the program and maintains a cumulative minimum grade point average of 3.3 (A = 4.0).

The Jordan Scholars (5350)

This Fund shall be used to provide tuition scholarship support for students who meet the following criteria:

- African American high school seniors admitted to Northern Arizona University;
- Minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0 (where 4.0 = A);
- Majoring in Accounting, Computer Information Systems, Economics, Finance, Management, or Marketing in The W.A. Franke College of Business;
- Students are eligible for continuation of the scholarship, should they maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 for the most recent academic term;
- In 1,500 words or less, Students will complete an application essay answering the following questions: 1. Provide a brief personal background. 2. What does entrepreneurship mean to you? 3. Describe any personal experiences or outside influences that framed the foundation of your interest in business and/or entrepreneurship. 4. Describe what you believe to be the qualities of a successful entrepreneur and how those qualities align with your own strengths. 5. What do you hope to learn from The W.A. Franke College of Business that will help you become a successful business leader or entrepreneur?

Preference given to students pursuing an interest in entrepreneurship.

Students are eligible for continuation of the scholarship, should they maintain the above criteria. Jordan Scholars are encouraged to participate in the 5-week NAU STARS Program (Successful Transition and Academic Readiness) during summer before their freshman year.

Warner and Nethercot Scholarship for Native American Women in Hospitality (1411)

This Fund shall be used to provide scholarships to students who are enrolled in the NAU School of Hotel and Restaurant Management, who have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and who have demonstrated financial need based upon information provided by the NAU Office of Financial Aid. Preference will be given to female Native American students.
